In 1912 this park with an ocean view was courageously open to all races, it only lasted until 1924. It was renamed in 2006 for it's first residents - African Americans.
An example of Millard Sheets handiwork.
Mural on the side of a building or wall. An actual mural, not graffiti. Up to 10 murals @ 30 points each. 100 Bonus Points if it has the Mona Lisa in a sombrero, crate of figs, or an orangutan.
His was the most famous stunt in silent movies in Steamboat Bill Jr. Go where his studio was.
An on duty police officer wearing shorts.
In the 1870's A Golden Spike was driven here.
Your Pack, Troop or Crew number on a building. You can not post it there.
Your favorite character at Peanuts Bridge.
The tree on the left side of the back of the \$20 bill was propagated by Lady Bird Johnson and now lives in the city that has earned a Tree City USA Award for the past 31 straight years.
The original Der Weinerschnitzel.
An on duty mounted Law Enforcement Officer on his or her steed.
The cemetery that was a Butterfield Stage Coach stop.
With your Patrol Advisor kissing a live frog.
Ice Cream truck.
A guide dog for the blind and its owner. Rules: Don't startle the dog or owner when you approach. Ask the owner if you have permission to take the photo. Explain why you are asking for the photo. Do not pet the guide dog. Thank the owner whether they say yes or no.

How many times have you driven to Lake Arrowhead? That's probably how many times you have driven by the natural landmark that gives the lake its name - and never even seen it. Find the landmark in the background with the plaque in the foreground.

When's the last time you rode the stagecoach? You have that opportunity at the San Bernardino County Museum. Find it, dress yourselves up in the dress of the period and take your photo. If you are in your Scout Uniform and if you say you are with the Patrol Challenge you should have a reduced rate admission of Adults \$5 and Scouts \$4. Jolene, Tara or Leslie are your contacts.

Congress designated this National Memorial and President Bush dedicated it in 2004. It honors and recognizes our POW's and MIA's since the Revolutionary War.

The giant pig skull behind the petrified wood wall at the place that has the largest collection of Chinese Dinosaur eggs in North America.

Special chair built for the fattest US President.

The billion dollar CA citrus industry is traced back to 1 woman. Find her 10' tall bronze statue.

The tree that ties together the Chicago White Sox and Riverside.

This actual tree was responsible for the "2nd" California Gold Rush. It caused Riverside to have the highest per capita income of all cities in the entire US around the turn of the century.

Giant Mammoth on a hill.

The cities of Sendai, Ensenada, Hyderabad, Gangnam, Jiangmen, Cuautla, Obuasi and Erlangen all intersect at this street sign.

Discover Downtown LA. See places new & old - you're guaranteed to find things unknown to you.

Manhole cover that states made in India.

20 foot tall friendship knot.

Suit of armor at the first institution of higher learning in Southern California.

Ever made ice cream? Ever made ice cream with a bicycle?

Mulholland built the LA Aqueduct. But it would never have happened without this state Senator. Find the ironically waterless water fountain honoring him.

A 50' Yagura.

This remarkable woman founded the first African American Church in Los Angeles. Your photo is with the wheels at her park. Read her story; you will be amazed what one person can accomplish.

This beacon was last lit in honor of a PC hero of ours - Huell Howser. Your photo is up in the observation deck of the building that it calls home.

A Dodger black widow.

Tribute or recognition in the area relating to the person who said, "One of the prisoners is a good carpenter, another an electrician. Each night I pray they will arrest a bricklayer and a plumber."

The unusual establishment that mixes ukuleles and coffee.

The oldest public art sculpture in Los Angeles.

Police Officers protect us which means they can be in dangerous situations. Go to the memorial of fallen LAPD Officers and find the only Reserve Policeman to be honored.

PATROL ACTIVITIES

Echo Park Lake - Saturday 9-4 only - be there, you won't be sorry! Jack the Ogre will be waiting for you. **This activity has a 10,000 point Bonus Pool. The Bonus Pool is divided among all Patrols that complete the task.**

300 points for each of the top 25 Patrols with the most food.

25 top Patrols determined by average bags per Patrol member. A **Bonus Pool** of 10,000 points will be divided among all Patrols that average 6 bags or more per Patrol member.
